Winter's greetings from the Chair

What a joy it was to have a full season in the summer of 2023 and to return once more to our historic Conant Lodge, open and renovated so lovingly. Steve Pelletier and his crew continued through the summer adding final touches week by week, and he finished his work in the autumn. The grounds received a thorough restoration at and after Closing 2023, narrowing roads back to Camp width, adding shrubbery, flowers, shade trees, and grading the areas around the roadway and walkways to reduce rain pooling. All the volunteers who served on the committees that designed the Lodge and Kitchen, raised the funds to complete the project, and those who managed the building itself, led by volunteer Jan Irvin deserve one last virtual High Five! Jan continues his good work with the project rep, Andy Chalmers, to create manuals for volunteers and staff to care for the building under all conditions. The solar array is installed now, another project spurred on by volunteers and overseen by Jan and Andy.

Guests made great use of the new space east of the main fireplace as we had some rainy weeks in 2023. The common remark was that it felt like the new dining room had always been there, yet it offered a welcome enlarged space for dining and games and beautiful views from every table. Thanks to Emmy & Hillary, Miranda, and Ellie, for learning on the fly how to manage the staff and croo in the new kitchen, especially under such a time constraint in Prep Week. The Extension group, led by Chris Clyne, enjoyed not only the refurbished Lodge but some of the best weather of the summer.

After such unusual years of construction and covid, Cold River Camp is ready to return to its regular rhythm. The Governance program of five Teams (Facilities, Finance, Recruiting, Marketing & Communications, and Land & Waters) is working well. Volunteers serve on a Team that calls to them, and only Team Leaders need to be on the full CRC Committee, so we can embrace more volunteers with expertise in certain areas. It is gratifying to see how many guests stepped up when asked last summer to join a Team or to become a hike leader or naturalist. We are looking for more members to join the Marketing Team to help us spread the good word about the joys of Cold River Camp.

Please continue to reach out if you feel you have time to share your talents with Cold River or nominate candidates that you think would serve Camp well, since folks rotate off every 2-3 years. Now I would like you to join me in thanking two of our longtime volunteers!

Frank Mastro, Facilities Coordinator for the past 30+ years, has stepped aside to remain a member of the Team. His tireless dedication to CRC deserves our special thanks as he oversaw every aspect of the facility and found appropriate craftspeople to keep Camp running. His instigation to enlarge the dining area spurred us on to build the beautiful new dining hall. He worked on the Greely bathhouse, Women's, Men's, new cabins, cabin refurbishment, designed cubbies and layouts, found the Jotul stoves, and gathered a strong group of talented volunteers to support his endeavors. I cannot

capture the complete list of behind the scenes work that Frank has done, but I applaud his characteristic care to reduce costs to Camp while making guests and staff more comfortable. He has advised many a Chair, collaborated with volunteers and management, and remains a great friend to many, particularly those who come during his favorite time of year at Extension. David Graham will take up the role of Facilities Coordinator.

Another veteran volunteer of 20+ years, Bill Gross, will step aside at the end of the 2024 season. Bill has done his utmost to fill the roster each week with hike leaders and naturalists, keeping tabs on their certification process and their skill set, and setting a standard for what it means to be a CRC leader. He has written formal CRC manuals for hike leaders and paddle leaders, expanding upon the AMC leadership manuals, and he has worked with AMC's risk management team to ensure the best outing experience for CRC guests. Bill has shared his job description for interested volunteers to consider taking on, yet he proposed an option of two people sharing the duties. Amy Grover will shadow Bill this year for the administrative side of the duties while we wait for a hike leader volunteer to emerge to manage the pool of leaders and interns. As a hiking camp, we owe Bill a debt of gratitude for his many years of service.

Since I took on the responsibility of CRC Chair in 2020, and the major projects are complete, it is time for me to step aside for new leadership for the 2024 season. MaryStarr Hope and Oz Osborne have agreed to take on the Chair and Vice Chair positions, while I will serve another

year as Immediate Past Chair. The five Team Leaders who are among the thirteen voting CRCC members will organize their Teams of volunteers to address projects ahead of us concerning infrastructure and grounds, but also aim for higher guest attendance and raise the number of volunteers in all areas.

Some infrastructure projects include ongoing cabin and roof upgrades, the Mabel Chester Dam restoration, view protection and wood management, water supply, garden restoration, and a few ADA projects. We always need more volunteer leadership, whether on Committee, a Team, or as a leader at Camp. The heart of Cold River Camp lies in its volunteer nature, where the CRCC and guest feedback make Cold River what it is. Please consider being a part of the team that makes CRC run. We are the second of the historic Volunteer Camps & Cabins (VCCs) to Three Mile Island, with Echo Lake shortly behind us. We are a part of the AMC, yet our volunteer board runs the Camp, makes financial decisions, and sets the tone for our weekly experience. In my many years as hike leader, committee member, ad hoc committee member, and volunteer at Closing, and now Chair, I have met many friends and found people with a passion for the outdoors that includes a desire to share that joy with others. In each role, my CRC volunteer service made me fonder of all that Cold River Camp means.

Thank you for your support over these tumultuous four years! I hope to see you on the Porch or on the trails in 2024.

The latest on the Conant Lodge renovation project—and solar panel installation

Since our last Little Deer Dispatch update, the dedication ceremony for the newly renovated Conant Lodge was held on August 19, 2023. The celebration was attended by more than 50 volunteers, donors, AMC dignitaries, and guests, as well as the local project managers, architects, and builders who renovated the building for its next 100 years serving outdoors enthusiasts of all ages.

Jan Lyle Irvin, AIA, shared his insights as one of the concept design architects. He was also the recipient of the 2022 AMC Volunteer Leadership Award for being a leader who demonstrated the desire to share his time and expertise in the pursuit of AMC's mission to foster the protection, enjoyment, and understanding of the outdoors.

As a part of the Lodge renovation, the Camp has also taken a huge step to work towards AMC's goal of net-zero greenhouse emissions and a reduction in carbon emissions by adding two solar arrays (with potential for an additional array) next to the south service road. By year end, Conant Lodge will use solar energy

to power a portion of its operations and reduce its overall carbon footprint.

In February 2024, similar to AMC's Annual Trail Sign Auction, CRC will be holding an eBay auction in support of the Conant Lodge Capital Campaign. One-of-a-kind signs from cabins that were recently renamed, as well many of the camp's muchloved kerosene lanterns will be available for you to bid on. In the coming weeks, we will be sending out information on how to bid in this one-week only auction. Complete descriptions of the cabin signs and the number of lanterns available will be sent out via email as well as posted on CRC's web page, Facebook, and Instagram accounts.

Over 100 donors have given to the Campaign, and are helping to build for our future. There is still time for you to make a lasting commitment to Camp by donating and joining those who have already stepped up to help. We cannot thank you enough for helping to sustain the spirit of the Camp for future generations.

^{*}During weeks two and four of the summer season, up to 2 children under the age of 12, per paying adult, can stay for free.

- The summer season is nine weeks.
- There is no minimum age for children.
- All-inclusive summer and extension rates include lodging, three meals a day, activities (excluding river trips), cabin firewood, ice, and support of AMC programs.
- Rates include AMC surcharge. A New Hampshire lodging tax of 5.1% is not included in rates. Non-member rates are +20 percent of AMC member rates.
- The summer season daily rate is 1/5 of the applicable weekly rate.

Additional details

A deposit of \$200 per person (summer) and \$125 (extension) is required with your reservation request. Full payment is due at the end of your stay. We accept checks and cash only, no credit cards.

A valid AMC member number for each camper must be provided with registration or at checkout to receive the lower AMC member rate, otherwise campers will be billed at the non-member rate. Family Memberships include up to two adults and any children under 21 living in your household. The membership does not include family members living outside of your household.

To change or cancel a reservation between January 1 and June 18, you must notify the registrar, Lois Winkler, at (914) 747-3194 (please call before 9pm). After June 18, contact the summer manager, Emmy Holt, at crcmanagers@gmail.com or (603) 694-3291. You may substitute different named individuals with advance notice. Cancellations in whole or in part are subject to the following payment terms:

- Cancellations received prior to April 1st will receive a refund of 50% of your applicable deposit.
- Deposits will not be refunded after April 1st.
- In fairness to those denied space, payment in full is required if cancellation requests are not received at least 30 days prior to scheduled date of arrival.

Please consider purchasing trip insurance in case you need to cancel your reservation.

Online registrations

- Payment in full is required for all reservations at the time of submission.
- We use Square, which accepts credit cards.
- Cancellations received prior to April 1 will receive a refund of 50% of your applicable deposit.
- If in the rare case your reservation cannot be accommodated, the full amount will be refunded.
- In fairness to those denied space, payment in full is required if cancellation requests are not received at least 30 days prior to scheduled date of arrival.

Standard reservations during the July-August summer season are full-week, Saturday to Saturday. However, partial week stays are also an option. After April 1st, partial week reservation requests are accepted. This is a 3-night minimum reservation with a Saturday arrival or departure. Additionally, in weeks two and four, up to two children under the age of 12, per paying adult, can stay for free.

Late Summer Extension

The two weeks of summer extension feature a relaxed pace and some of the best hiking, biking and kayaking weather of the year. You choose the schedule that fits your needs, from two nights to two weeks. Guests bring their own bedding and towels but otherwise enjoy the usual Camp amenities, including three wholesome meals a day, served mornings and evenings, cafeteria-style. Visiting Camp in its changing seasons

Interested in cross-country skiing, hiking and snowshoeing in peaceful Evans Notch in the winter months? CRC's charming Evergreen cabin offers a cozy retreat for these activities from November until early May. While the cabin books up quickly, some winter weeknights and early spring weekends are still available.

The cabin features a six-bed bunkroom, with floor space for additional
guests, and a multipurpose area
equipped with a small kitchen area
and wood stove. There is a small
refrigerator, a microwave, a coffee
maker, a toaster, and a hot water
kettle in the kitchen. Plates, mugs,
bowls and cookware are also provided. Evergreen is winterized and has
electricity, but please note: there is
no running water. Guests must bring

their own water, food, bedding and linens. Blankets, pillows and wood for the stove are provided. A heated outhouse is near the cabin.

2023-24 seasons rates are \$154.40/night. Payment in advance is requested and can be made online. If interested, please contact the Evergreen cabin registrar for information and reservations. CRC policy information

Smoking and vaping

Smoking and vaping are not allowed in Camp or on group activities outside Camp.

Aerial drones

Use of drones in/above Camp or on led trips is generally not permitted. Special exceptions may be considered with the consent of the Camp manager/assistant manager/event manager in Camp, or trip leader for the led trip out of Camp.

Use of personal electronic

Use of personal electronic devices

The Cold River Camp experience centers on enjoyment of nature and guest interactions, away from the routine of everyday life. Accordingly, our personal electronic devices policy is:

- Device use in the lodge, on the lodge porch, or in the lodge vicinity is limited to reading/viewing of information. Devices are to be put away during meals.
- Any form of device communication (voice/text/email/video, etc., incoming or outgoing) should be done discreetly, away from other guests, and away

- from the lodge and its vicinity.
- Device use for personal entertainment (e.g., watching videos or playing video games) is limited to the guest cabins.
- Cords and device charging are to be kept within the confines of the charging station area in the Rec Hall.

Recognizing the occasional need of some guests to communicate with the outside world or to do personal work, Wi-Fi access is available solely for those purposes, as a courtesy, in the area outside the camp office and, to the extent there is signal, in the Rec Hall and Library.

The Rec Hall is available, shared with other uses, between the hours of 7:30 AM and 9:30 PM and outside of scheduled activities there. The camp office and porch are off-limits. In any case, noise from PEDs must not intrude on other guests' or staff enjoyment of natural sounds or stillness or human conversation or ability to sleep, or the tranquility of the Library.

Dining policy

CRC serves guests two hearty, hot meals and one trail lunch daily. All meals are homemade with fresh, seasonal ingredients and served family style or buffet. A vegan/vegetarian option will always be available to those who have requested vegetarian meals during registration. Life-threatening allergens (ie., tree nuts and shellfish) are kept separate from the main food prep and communal serving areas, but CRC cannot guarantee there will not be some chance of cross-contamination and exposure; campers are advised of this risk. CRC will provide plant-based milk and gluten-free wraps or bread. Because of kitchen limitations, CRC is unable to accommodate special diets or preferences. We encourage guests to bring what they need to manage personal dietary choices when packing for camp. Be mindful, however, of attracting mice and other animals to cabins, so please bring containers to seal your food items and store them in your car. Dispose of trash and recycling at the Housekeeping shed.
